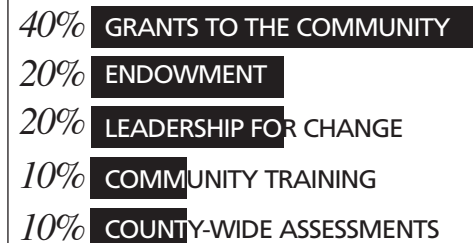
We're heartened by documented reductions in teen tobacco use, second hand smoke, binge drinking, and increasing use of seat belts. Perhaps our most treasured community success is the development of Reach Your Destination Easily, commonly known as RYDE, that was developed by a group of concerned citizens roughly 10 years ago. Today, this system coordinates community transportation needs for more than 90,000 residents.

Thanks to those documented community outcomes, \$400,000 in grant-funded programs is available to our communities each year through Buffalo County Community Partners. Those documented outcomes also help Buffalo County Community Partners leverage \$1.5 million in grant-funded projects annually in Buffalo County, effectively reaching a majority of all ages of Buffalo County citizens.

Every \$1 donated to Buffalo County Community Partners is matched by \$3 in grant funding. Our local donors are supporting significant change in Buffalo County! Funds are designated to the following budgeted categories noted to the right.

The Buffalo County Community Partners Board of Directors and Staff are pleased to announce that 70% of the "TOP TEN by 2010" Goals have been attained or moving toward targets by the efforts of over 1000 volunteers and organizations in Buffalo County. The 2010 Annual Report to the Community illustrates our community's accomplishments over past ten years and presents new strategic directions for 2020.

Buffalo County 2020 Vision was developed by 300 residents who participated in mini-town hall meetings in 2009. Residents defined their vision for a healthier community and prioritized a list of issues to be address through 2020. Buffalo County Community Partners commissioned three surveys to research risky behaviors and health factors. The data contained in the 2010 Annual Report was secured through 2010 Buffalo County Youth Behavioral Risk Factor Survey, 2010 Adult and Minority Behavioral Risk Factor Survey and 2009 Focus Group Report. All

documents are available on Buffalo County Community Partners Web Site, www.bcchp.org.

Today, Buffalo County Community Partners releases Buffalo County 2020 Vision to community members to ELEVATE priority issues, ENGAGE residents and organizations in prioritizing their time and resources on issues of highest importance, EMPOWERING residents to create positive change in their community, and EVALUATE our community's success every year. By working on these issues together, Buffalo County is leading the nation in 'best practices' to eliminate health disparities, building healthy families, sustaining communities, emphasizing high impact prevention and injury free living.
